Foundation Subjects:

- Science: Space topic assessment. Answer these four questions: How do the Earth and other planets move relative to the sun in the solar system? How does the moon move relative to the Earth? What shape are the sun, Earth and moon? Can you explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky? Please email your answers to us. You could also go to School 360, 'Busy Things' and explore the 'Space Activity Pack'.
- History: Watch this <u>video</u> to find out about Anglo-Saxon homes. Draw or make a model of an Anglo-Saxon home. Can you add labels or make an audio recording to tell us what you have included?
