## Science:

**Plants** 

- -I would like you to think about what plants need to grow and write down what you think. Then research or investigate if your initial thoughts were correct.
- -Once you know what a plant needs to grow, if possible, I would like you to plant a seed such as a sunflower or a bean and record its progress through photographs or sketches.
- -Investigation: Can a plant grow in the dark?

First make a prediction of whether you think the seed will grow.

Now, plant a second seed and place it in a dark place and observe over time what happens to it.

Compare the two different seeds.
