- Can you complete any of the practical activities on page 2 and can your grown up upload it onto school 360?
- Can you find different items around your house and put them in size order? Which is the biggest? Which is the smallest?

Other Areas of Learning:

Expressive Arts and Design: **(see page 2 for emergency services craft activities)**

- Can you make a fire engine, ambulance or police car out of different materials that you have in your house?
- Can you draw a picture of a firefighter, police officer or paramedic? What colour is the uniform that they wear?

Communication and Language:

- This week in maths we are learning about size. Can you read the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears and talk about the size of the different bears (daddy bear, mammy bear and baby bear)? You could even get different sized bowls in your home and match them to the correct bear.
- Can you listen to the song of 5 little firemen (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9qIAhEtk13M>) and talk to your grown up about what you can see? You could even act this out yourself and with some of your toys!

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

- Our story in literacy this week is about a brave bear. Do you know what it means to be brave? Can you talk to your grown up about firefighters, police officers and paramedics and why you think they might have to be brave?
- Can you do some baking or cooking with your grown up? You could maybe bake cupcakes or make a fruit salad.

- Can you copy writing your name? Do you recognise any of the letters in your name? Can you see any of the letters around your house?
- Can you do any of the fine motor activities on page 2 of this document? Look at the pictures to help you.

Paramedics:

What Job Does a Paramedic Do?

A paramedic's job is to give emergency care to very sick or hurt people.
They may travel in an ambulance, car, motorbike or bicycle.
They use their equipment to be the first to give medical help and they often save lives.



Paramedics work very long hours. They work in the day and in the night.
In an emergency, a paramedic will be there to look after anyone who is hurt while they travel to a hospital.

Where Do They Work?

Paramedics usually work in ambulances.

They may also drive emergency response cars, motorbikes, bicycles or helicopters to get to the scene of an emergency.

They may have to help very sick or hurt people inside or outside, whatever the weather.
