Sequencing 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' story

Imagination:

Using the story sequencing cards (see worksheet), allow the children to arrange the cards in any order and make up their own story. You may want to model this first so they have a clearer understanding.

Memory Sequencing:

Read the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' - PDF Interactive book -

Talk throughout the story of them predicting what he might eat next etc.

After the story using the sequencing cards (same as above) ask them to try and order the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. Can they order it correctly?

Retelling the Story:

Using the sequencing Cards can you retell the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.

Can you video record yourself retelling the story? I would love to see you tell the story!

Expressive Art and Design

Create your own beautiful butterfly

Using different materials found from around your home or garden can you create your very own beautiful butterfly.

Remember you can also make shadows using torches on walls.
Can you try taking pictures of butterflies?

Numeracy

Fingerprint caterpillar

Use your fingerprint to make a body for each caterpillar. Can you do the correct amount of fingerprints to match the number next to each caterpillar?

(Use the worksheet.)

Number Formation

We have already practised writing numbers, 1, 2, 3 and 4

Can you practise writing the number 6

Our rhyme to remember this numeral is:

Bend down low to pick up sticks, now i've made the number six.

You might be able to make the number six using sticks yourself.

Letter Formation

So far we have practised writing the letters,

m a s d t i n

The next letters we are focusing on are

p and g

You could practise writing these letters in the air with your finger, then practise forming these letters using pens, pencils paints etc.

The rhymes for these new letters are:

p - down the plait and around the pirates face

g - round her face, down her hair and give her a curl

Remember to keep practising the letters we have learned so far.
