## **Mathematics:**

Our learning objective this week is positional language (linking to our story We're Going on a Bear Hunt):

- Can you use a teddy to show the different actions for example, can your grown up ask you questions like 'can you put the bear under the chair?' ... Can you explore other words such as over, behind, beside, in between, next to, on top of, inside?

- Can you complete any of the positional language activities from the attached PDF file?

#### <u>Literacy:</u>

This week in literacy we are reading and learning about the story We're Going on a Bear Hunt (if you do not have this storybook at home you can find it on google/ youtube).

- Can you make your own story map of the Bear Hunt and sequence the different parts of the story? You could make your own sensory bottles or use resources that you have at home! Can you then retell the story using the props or the story picture cards? (PDF file attached)

# Expressive Arts and Design:

- Can you make a craft that looks like the woods?
- Can you make your own bear hunt craft?

- Have you been to the woods before? What does it look like in the woods? Can you talk to your grown up about which animals live in the woods? (see attached powerpoint for more information). A story called The Gruffalo by Julia Donaldson is based in the woods. Can you share that story with your grown up and talk about what you can see from the pictures?

- Can you make a teddy bears picnic with your grown up? What kind of food would you prepare? What is your favourite food?

- Can you create different movements to retell the story of We're Going on a Bear Hunt based on the different pages? You could tiptoe through the cave, skip through the grass and do big steps through the mud.
