The Government provides funding each year to schools to spend on improving the quality of P.E. and sport. The funding is ring-fenced, which means that it can only be spent on P.E. and sport. Each school receives a specific lump sum, plus an amount of money per pupil in year 1-6. At Ellington Primary school we received £17,506 in 2019-20.
