

### **ELLINGTON PRIMARY SCHOOL SPORTS PREMIUM INFORMATION 2019-20**

The Government provides funding each year to schools to spend on improving the quality of P.E. and sport. The funding is ring-fenced, which means that it can only be spent on P.E. and sport. Each school receives a specific lump sum, plus an amount of money per pupil in year 1-6. At Ellington Primary school we received £17,506 in 2019-20. The breakdown of the school's planned spending is as follows:

The expertise of the specialist P.E. coach will further develop the confidence and competence of staff in teaching and assessing Upper Key Stage 2 P.E. to make it sustainable in the future.	<p>All pupils receive high quality P.E. activities, an example of this is the gymnastics video on the school website of year 3 and 4. This was a presentation of achievement to the parents and was completed by each year group.</p> <p>Support staff are confident in supporting delivery of P.E. and engaging pupils in P.E. and sport outside of lesson time.</p> <p>P.E. lessons were impacted by closure, but teachers included physical activities in their home learning plans.</p> <p>Assessment activities were carried out in all year groups and used to inform parents in end-of-year reports.</p>
£2500.00	Specialist P.E. coach to support delivery of Year 1 and 2 P.E.	To continue to support specialist P.E. teaching and assessment in Key Stage 1 classes. The expertise of the specialist P.E. coach will further develop the confidence and competence of staff in teaching and assessing Key Stage 1 P.E. to make it sustainable in the future.	
£1,500.00	Specialist P.E. coach to support delivery of Lower Key Stage 2 P.E.	To continue to support Upper Lower Key Stage 2 staff in the delivery and assessment of a high quality P.E. curriculum. The expertise of the specialist P.E. coach will further develop the confidence and competence of staff in teaching and assessing Lower Key Stage 2 P.E. to make it sustainable in the future.	
£800.00	Specialist P.E. coach to support delivery of EYFS P.E.	To support EYFS staff in the delivery and assessment of a high quality P.E. curriculum. The expertise of the specialist P.E. coach will develop the confidence and competence of staff in teaching and assessing EYFS P.E. to make it sustainable in the future.	

£800.00	EYFS and small group Yoga sessions	To continue to allow our youngest children, and most vulnerable groups in years 1-6, access to a diverse range of P.E./PSHE activities.	Yoga was planned to be included in a program of PSHE activities, as a result of need to develop support for increasing number of children with mental health and wellbeing issues. This program was started but yoga was not introduced into the program prior to lockdown.
£6270.00	Activity supervisor in KS1 and KS2	To ensure that children continue to have access at break times and dinner times to organised sporting activities, with the aim of improving behaviour and engagement across Key Stage 1 and 2. To provide training to colleagues to ensure sustainability. To provide opportunities for all children in Key Stage 1 and 2 to access a wider variety of sports clubs, festivals and tournaments.	Prior to lockdown, children were engaged in a wide variety of activities outside of school hours, at lunch times and in after school clubs. The school was very successful in tournaments that were accessed.
£1500.00	Transport to Partnership festivals and competitions.	To continue to provide access to an increasingly diverse range of competitive and non-competitive festivals and competitions.	
£3000.00	Swimming in Lower KS2	To ensure that all of the children in Key Stage 2 have the opportunity to work towards their 25 metre badge in swimming and to increase the children's overall confidence in water, which is particularly relevant given the school's coastal setting.	Swimming activities were provided for year 3 and 4 until lockdown, and all children were making good progress. Year 6 catch up and additional lifesaving lessons did not take place in the Summer term. The year 6 cohort consisted of five children. 75% in the cohort at the start of the year were able to swim 25m confidently following swimming lessons in year 3 and 4. The additional child who joined the school in year 6 had not achieved this and was not able to access catch-up lessons in the Summer term due to lockdown.
	Year 6 catch-up swimming lessons for children not yet achieving the expected level and self-rescue sessions for all year 6 children.		

NB: Due to the national Covid-19 lockdown where schools were closed, we carried over £7,281 of Sport Premium funding to the academic year 2020-2021 (Please see separate document for details of how this underspend will be used). The amount carried forwards has to be spent by July 2021.
