Rhyming Words

Can you sort the coins (see activity sheet) into the treasure chests? Can you make some more coins to go into the rhyming sets?

Adult to say the words before the children repeat so that it is clearer to hear if they rhyme or don't rhyme.

You could practise writing these letters in the air with your finger, then practise forming these letters using pens, pencils, paints etc.

The rhymes for these new letters are:

y - down a horn, up a horn and under his head.

w - down up, down up

Practise singing the alphabet song. Can you recognise the different letters by looking at them?

Can you write the different letters that a grown up says to you? Practise forming them correctly.
