- Can you make your own minibeast home?

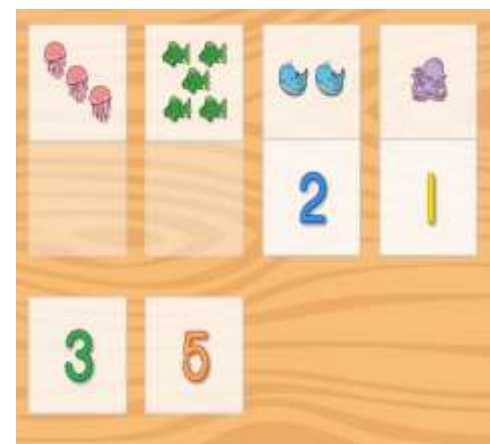
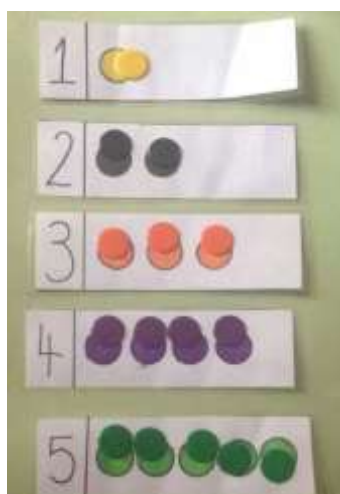
Physical Development:
