Covid Outbreak Contingency Plan – January 2022



When should my child selfisolate or miss school?



- All children MUST attend school unless they are ill or have tested positive for Covid.
- From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or doublevaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- Instead, they are strongly advised to take a LFT test every day for 7 days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result.





NO

- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should take a Lateral Flow Test (LFT).
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and should take a LFT. If your child tests positive on a LFT they do not need to book a PCR test. They need to self-isolate for a minimum of 5 full days. They can end their isolation from day 6, if they have a negative LFT on days 5 and 6. Or if they have two negative LFTs 24 hours apart after day 6. If they continue to test positive on a LFT, they must isolate for ten days.

Community Covid Risk

Low Community Transmission. No School Cases.

- There have been no cases of Covid within school for 10 school days.
- Cases of Covid locally are low and/ or stable.
- Hospitalisation/Deaths due to Covid nationally are low.
- No Covid measures are necessary beyond:
- Reminding children of good hand-hygiene.
- Ensuring good ventilation encouraged where practical.
- Ensuring Children / Staff to stay at home if they have Covid Symptoms (and to book a PCR test).
- Staff will continue to test themselves twice weekly using Lateral flow tests.



Rapidly Rising Community Transmissi on

- No current Covid cases have been recorded at school, but...
- Cases of Covid are rising rapidly in the community causing disruption to other local schools.
- NCC Public Health / Public Health England issue warnings of expected local/ national infection wave
- Ventilation of classrooms increased & handwashing supervised.
- Large indoor public performance audience numbers reduced.
- Staff-room capacity is reduced.
- Whole-school assemblies are replaced with Key Stage assemblies.
- Clinically Vulnerable staff meet with Line-Managers to review their individual risk assessment & discuss additional protection (e.g. use of face coverings, reduction in movement between classes/ groups).

- A single child tests positive for Covid in a class.
- There are fewer than 5 cases in the year group.
- No other year groups are affected.
- The child self-isolates. If they test negative on a LFT on day 5 and day 6 of their isolation, and they do not have a high temperature, they may end their isolation on day 6. If they continue to have a high temperature and test positive on a LFT they must isolate for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it.
- Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Track & Trace. From 14.12.21, adults who are fully vaccinated and all children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 are strongly advised to take a LFD test every day for 7 days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result.



5 children or staff within a year group test positive within 10 days of each other.

<u>OR</u>

3 children or staff in a single Class/ Club (or Resource Base) within 10 days. There have been 5
cases of Covid across
a year group within 10
days which could mean
that Covid is spreading
within that group of
children.

- As above for each positive case.
- The school will discuss the outbreak with Northumberland Public Health and agree strengthening protective measures for 10 school days, including:
 - Re-introducing staff face masks for corridors & communal areas.
 - Adapting, Limiting or postponing indoor sporting events, trips, open days and performances.
 - Reverting to video-link Assemblies in classrooms.
 - Reducing the amount of classes staff work across.



Covid cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10 day period.

Despite the measures indicated above, Covid cases within the school continue to rise within a 10 day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that Covid is spreading widely throughout the school.

- Incident Management Team meeting held between the school and Northumberland Public Health to agree further measures, for a further 10 school days, including possibly:
 - Re-introducing class bubbles.
 - Reverting to class-based school lunches.
 - Limiting all non-essential visitors to school.
 - Postponing all non-essential events.
 - Re-introducing remote learning for individual classes for 10 school days considered.
