
- Monday: <u>Rounding decimals</u>

## English:

**Wednesday:** Go here for the text of Alice in Wonderland: <u>https://www.gutenberg.org/files/11/11-h/11-h.htm</u> scroll down about halfway to Chapter 7 (The Mad Hatter's Tea Party). Read the chapter, making a note of any unfamiliar words as you go. Look up the meanings of those words and copy their meanings out. At the end of the chapter, Alice finds herself in the garden. Write a setting description describing everything that Alice can see and hear in the garden, including any curious creatures she might meet there.

- **Thursday:** Read Chapter 8 (The Queen's Croquet Ground). Look up the meanings of any unfamiliar words. At the end of the chapter the Duchess arrives. Imagine a frosty conversation between the Queen and Duchess, with Alice joining in to make peace between the two of them. Write out the conversation, remembering to include adverbs to describe how they speak to each other (eg angrily, icily, indignantly, sharply, sternly etc)
- Friday: Read Chapter 9. At the end of the chapter, write a letter from Alice to the Queen. Alice should suggest to the Queen that ordering so many beheadings is unfair and cruel. Alice should attempt to persuade her to be kinder and less strict with people. Include rhetorical questions, and emotive language (remember to write in paragraphs).

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- Science: Identify forces acting on objects. Who was Issac Newton? (This work was completed in school on Monday)
- Homework: In school360, go to resources, encyclopaedia and then 'Q-Files'. Read the page on forces and write out three new facts that you learnt about forces.
- Geography: Log onto Busy Things (School 360→ resources → Busy Things → year 5 code if needed is peg 18) and in 'my assignments' you will find interactive maps to label for the UK and the rest of the world.
